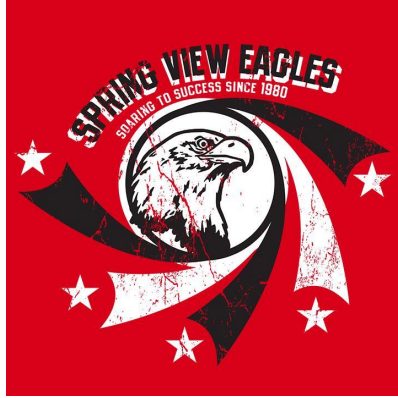

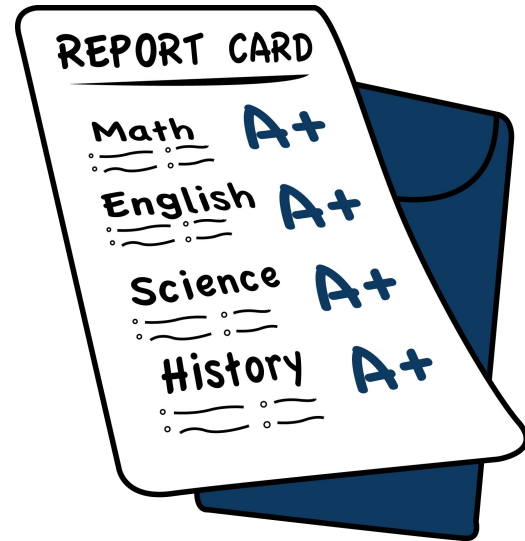

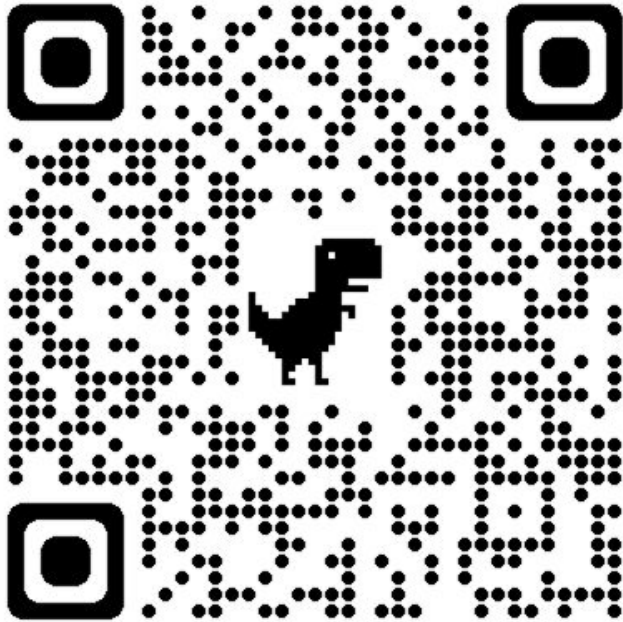

SOCIAL MEDIA

Statistics show that teenagers spend about an hour and a half on social media every day. The following are suggestions for middle schoolers from Common Sense Media:

Follow the rules. Many social sites have an age minimum of 13 by law and for reasons of safety and privacy. Encourage kids to stick to age-appropriate sites.

Tell your kids to think before they post. Remind them that everything they post can be seen by a vast, invisible audience (otherwise known as friends of friends of friends). With middle schoolers, it's a good idea for parents and caregivers to have access to what their kids are doing online. That way, you can be sure that what they're posting is appropriate, and help your kids avoid doing something they'll regret later.

Make sure kids set their privacy settings. Privacy settings aren't foolproof, but they can be helpful. Take the time to learn about default settings and how to change the privacy settings on your kids' favorite sites and apps, and teach them how to be in control of what they share.

Kindness counts. Lots of sites have anonymous features, such as Q&As and discussion channels, that allow users to tell their friends what they think of them. Rule of thumb: If your kids wouldn't say it to someone's face, they shouldn't post it.

CELL PHONE POLICY

CELL PHONES AND OTHER TECHNOLOGY MUST BE TURNED OFF AND PUT AWAY DURING SCHOOL HOURS.

Students who are seen with their cell phone, earbuds, or other technology out and/or in use will be assigned consequences. The cell phone and/or earbuds will be confiscated by the school and made available in Student Services for the parent to pick up. Students are not allowed to play music through an external speaker or audibly through cell phone speakers at ANY time on campus, including before or after school.

MERITS

Merit Program: All students begin each quarter with 100 merits. Students will be notified by school personnel when they are issued a behavior slip and merit loss. Notice of rule infractions will be forwarded to the office on the proper form. Merit loss will be recorded in the student's behavior file.

Loss of all quarterly extracurricular activities—including school dances and rallies—will result if the current quarter merit status falls below 100 merits.

Students who have lost merits may complete a Merit Retrieval Contract. These are available in Student Services.

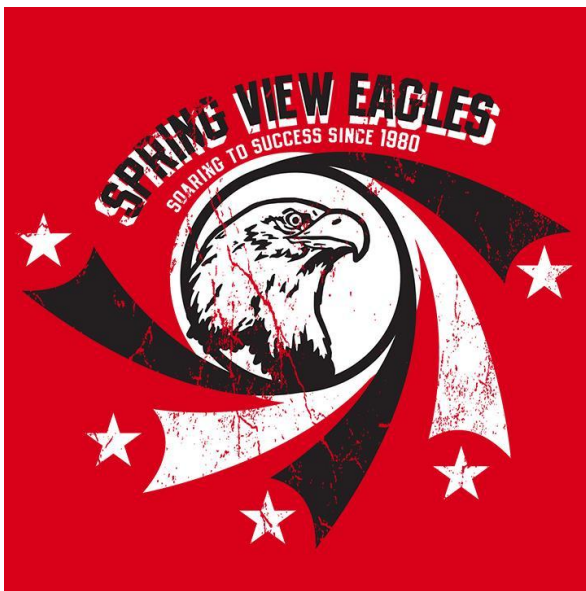
